


• 17h00 Glasgow Architectal tour: walk through the city

Barcelona has Gaudí, Chicago has Frank Lloyd Wright and Glasgow has the pioneering Art Nouveau of Charles Rennie Mackintosh.

As an architect, designer and artist, Glasgow's most famous son has left a magnificent legacy of buildings, drawings, designs and motifs stamped upon his home city. Mackintosh designed a range of key city buildings, from educational facilities to tea rooms, from church halls to newspaper headquarters - so where to begin?


Embark on a journey through the unique architectural staples of Glasgow, including:





Day 1

- **Kelvingrove Museum**, which houses one of Europe's great civic art collections. The gallery was designed by Sir John W. Simpson and E.J. Milner Allen and opened in 1901. It is built in a Spanish Baroque style, following the Glaswegian tradition of using Dumfriesshire red sandstone.
- •The Mackintosh House, where you can view the fully recreated interiors of Mackintosh and Margaret Macdonald Mackintosh's family home a meticulously reconstructed version of the private living space of the couple, including the original furniture.
- The Lighthouse, Mackintosh's first public commission, that was home to the Glasgow Herald newspaper before becoming the city's Centre for Architecture and Design.





Day 1

- The Egyptian Halls by Alexander Thomson on Union Street, a well-disguised commercial building behind an elaborate façade. The magnificent frontage has a row of shops at ground level. Above the shops the exterior is different at every storey, displaying a highly original selection of exotic themes.
- Mackintosh at the Willow is a world class cultural and heritage attraction. Miss Crantson's original Willow Tea Rooms at 217 Sauchiehall Street, were designed by Charles Rennie Mackintosh in 1903. This historic building is of the greatest significance for Scotland's design heritage. It is the only tea room where Mackintosh was in control of the exterior and the interior and his arrangement of the internal spaces and his designs for the furniture are unparalleled in his designs for tea rooms.





V&A Dundee


The breathtaking centrepiece of Dundee's reimagined waterfront is the fabulous V&A, designed by Japanese architect Kengo Kuma and opened in 2018 to much applause. Inspired by the cliffs that decorate the east coast of Scotland, and stretching out into the silvery Tay, the building itself is spectacular, reconnecting this old city with its historic riverside, but very much with its eye on the future.

• 15h50 The Falkirk Wheel

A masterful feat of civic engineering - and imagination - the Falkirk Wheel is the ingenious answer to a complex problem - how to link two canals when one is on a hill and the other 100ft below. The solution is the world's only rotating boat lift, carrying vessels 115ft above the Forth & Clyde Canal and delivering them to the Union Canal and enabling coast to coast navigation across central Scotland. 


